

# Numbers from NCIP (NZ)



- Prior to screening, the mean age at implantation =
   2.85 years (~2 years, 10 months)
- Mean age at implantation = 1.24 years (~14 months)
- 2/3 of the 18 children have additional disabilities/needs
- 5 children have been identified with ANSD



## Bilateral vs Unilateral



Of the 18 children who have received a cochlear implant:

39% Bilateral CI 61% unilateral CI

Of all the children who received bilateral Cls, 100% were implanted simultaneously



# Baby Workshop Feedback



- n 4/5 families thought that the Baby Workshop assisted them in becoming more connected with other parents
- n 4/5 families thought that the Baby Workshop gave them a better understanding of what might be involved with their babies' hearing journeys
- n 5/5 families were either very likely or likely to recommend the workshop to other families
